

Has it felt like something is missing from Immanuel? Reflecting on the past year and some months, we might say, "Are you kidding? Everything has changed, so much is missing!" While that may seem true, the heart and center of who we are as a congregation is still found in Jesus and God's Word and Sacraments. That has never changed and it still abides with us—it is what we are about!

But sometimes we might take that precious gift of Word and Sacrament for granted; we look to Jesus for our salvation but so often we act as if we don't need that message to come to us on a regular basis. When we think something may be missing or absent from Immanuel; that very thing might be us. The fellowship of believers needs all of us; it is in the collective that we find our encouragement; it is what brings the shared joy we experience in our faith community.

This summer has given us some opportunities to be together in community. Summer Son-Shine was held over five Wednesday evenings, as we gathered together for a shared meal, divided into three age groups for a Bible story, had ladies of the congregation lead a craft planned for the children and finally a game each night to wrap it all up. Young to old, retired folks to families with children, everyone in the faith community was invited to participate; and people came to just enjoy being together in community. The last Wednesday, as I sat at the table with my grandson, I glanced around and it truly looked like a huge family gathering; with people eating, visiting and laughing in two languages, kids moving about getting their ice cream and everyone having a good time. It truly made my heart smile. We need more of these moments; where we all (Church, Light of Christ and School) can enjoy being together as the faith family that we are. We need those moments to make our hearts smile.

Twenty years ago, we became the community and three-fold mission that we are today with the addition of Light of Christ Chinese Ministry. Last August, our community endeavored to send two members from Light of Christ through a non-residential deaconess program at Concordia Seminary; deaconesses help accentuate the caring work of the church. While doing their course work, Helen Qiu and Kan Hsu are also assigned to Light of Christ/Immanuel as deaconess interns. This summer, led by pastors and deaconess interns, Immanuel and Light of Christ are joining together one Sunday a month, to hold conversations on Christian Care; together we are talking about what it means and what this looks like in our own faith community. A bible study in both English and Chinese is a unique experience but in reality it is a beautiful reflection of the blessing that we already have in our own unique faith community.

By God's grace, Immanuel, Light of Christ and our school have been places where the good news of Jesus continues to be shared; thankfully that message has not been missing from our midst. But we need you; we need you to serve with us; we need you to be with us in fellowship; and we need you to be a part of the community, so that all our hearts may smile.


ALL MEN are Invited to Immanuel Men's Club

15th Annual School Supply Collection Recap

The Community Care Team's 15th Annual School Supply Collection took place during June and July. To be extra safe COVID-wise, we operated this year's collection as we did last year. The CCT used our own funds to purchase \$2,000 of gift cards to the four

30th Anniversary of the Jewish Food Pantry

The Harvey Kornblum Jewish Food Pantry served **21,500 individuals in 2020**, a **30% increase** over the prior year. In addition, the food pantry, which is a service provided by Jewish Family Services (JFS), recently celebrated its 30th anniversary. Located at 10601 Baur Blvd., the pantry is open Monday through Friday from 9 am to 2 pm. Individuals and families receive 10 days' worth of food every month including fresh produce, dairy, bread and shelf-

stable items. Since the onset of the pandemic, the pantry has adopted a drive-through distribution model to maintain the health and safety of its clients, staff and more than **200 volunteers**.

"We hope the pandemic has diminished the stigma of relying on a food pantry because now it's your neighbor and even your family members seeking help during this very trying time," said Harvey Kornblum Jewish Food Pantry Director Erica Steen. "In this new reality, we are assisting more guests who have never utilized a pantry. We are fortunate to be able to serve our community both now and throughout the past 30 years." JFS, which provides mental health and social services for all St. Louisans, created the food pantry in 1991 when it began serving 40 families. The pantry relies on monetary donations, private food drives, grocer donations and monthly food allocations from the USDA, Operation Food Search, and the St. Louis Area Foodbank. According to Steen, "We believe the need for food assistance will remain high, which is why we will continue providing aid to those who are seeking relief while facing ongoing challenges."

Founded in 1871, JFS is a multiservice nonprofit that supports families and seniors, alleviates hunger, and improves mental health for all St. Louisans. The organization serves individuals and families in crisis, as well as helps seniors remain independent and connected to the community. JFS supports the emotional and physical well-being of more than 50,000 area children, families, and seniors annually. For more information, call 314-993-1000 or visit jfsstl.org.

Steward Builders

To help you grow as a steward.

The purpose of this newsletter is to share God's Word so that our members will better understand who we are to be and what we are to do in the light of the Scriptures. It is our hope that this publication will help you grow in your relationship with the Lord and as a Christian steward.

LIVING A DISCIPLINED LIFESTYLE

The intimate relationship that Jesus establishes with us and through which we are enabled to grow is nurtured by a disciplined lifestyle that incorporates spiritual disciplines. Examples of spiritual disciplines are praying, worshiping, fasting, serving, and giving. Richard Foster, in his book Celebration of Discipline, writes "God has ordained the disciplines of the spiritual



life as the means by which we place ourselves where He can bless us." The spiritual disciplines that we develop will put us where Jesus can work within us to transform us and use us. By grace, God works through these disciplines to mold us

and change us into stewards who can bless others as we've been blessed.

Another benefit to spiritual disciplines is that they help us to acknowledge our dependence upon God. God is our power source, so we need to stay connected to Him. Spiritual disciplines train us to stay connected. In His Word, God promises never to forsake us (Hebrews 13:5). Although He promises never to leave us, we can sever that connection with Him at any time. However, without that connection with Him, we are no longer able to live as His children and as His stewards. Because spiritual disciplines remind us continually of God's sovereignty and our need for Him, we should incorporate spiritual disciplines into our lives.

In addition, spiritual disciplines help us evaluate our spiritual condition. If we aren't practicing spiritual spiritual disciplines in our lives, we are depriving

ourselves of an intimate relationship with Jesus, and we will not be able to practice a pleasing stewardship lifestyle.

STEWARDSHIP OF SELF

Failure to allow God to rule our lives or to become selfsufficient is sin. Augustine wrote, "Thou has made us for Thyself." Paul reminds us, "[We] are not [our] own; [we] were bought at a price" (1 Corinthians 6:19-20). When we fail to acknowledge our dependence upon God and follow our wills, we are rebelling against Him. Our will supersedes what God desires for us. Dr. Lynn Hough wrote, "The will is the last citadel of the personality. Stewardship which does not include the surrender of the will to God misses the very central application of our being God's possession."

Through the working of the Holy Spirit, we become people eager to live in a relationship with Jesus rather than in isolated independence. Christ initiated this relationship with us, and, in response, we give ourselves to Him and His work. We walk daily with Christ. An example of how an intimate relationship makes things work is that of a happy marriage. When there is a loving and giving relationship between husband and wife, there will be a happy and successful marriage. If the marriage is based only on rules and contracts, the marriage won't last. In the same way that spouses thrive when a loving relationship exists between them, we, as stewards, need an intimate relationship with Jesus in order to live productive and fulfilling stewardship lifestyles. When we have an intimate relationship with the Lord, we willingly live each day as stewards who practice stewardship lifestyles.

The giving of self is illustrated by Paul in 2 Corinthians 8:3-5. "For I testify that [the Macedonians] gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the saints. And they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will." In spite of their economic hardships, the Macedonians responded generously and sacrificially to the plight of the people in Jerusalem. They were able disciplines, we need to question why we aren't. Without to give beyond their ability because they had first given themselves to the Lord. The Macedonians found it a

privilege and a joy to give what they had to people in need. Because of their love relationship with Jesus, they



delighted in giving. Mature stewards do the right things for the right reasons.

God's Word and Sacraments are His means of grace through which He empowers us to give of ourselves. As the Holy Spirit works through Word and Sacraments, He teaches us to become givers


rather than takers and transforms us into people who use our lives, gifts, and resources in service to the Lord as


